Traveling on ice is a daily occurrence in this area and comes with dangers that can be mitigated but not completely avoided, if we're going to live life as needed. That's why your prayers are so appreciated, and why we cannot go without God's protective hand on us.

We are very excited to watch the LORD working on the hearts of various ones here in Napakiak. There are four teens in particular who want to follow God and do what's right – two boys and two girls. My wife and I are discipling them and praying that they will be able to grab ahold of a vision to serve God with their lives. The devil is fighting hard to keep them from that, but God is stronger! One of the boys, who's 15, has expressed a desire to be a preacher. He just preached his first message at our church this past Sunday evening, praise God!

One of the religious strongholds we deal with is baby baptism. People are



taught that they're saved because they were baptized as babies, and they should never be baptized again. This is a hard thing for certain ones to get past once they accept Christ as their Saviour – they see what the Bible says about baptism and that they should be baptized as an outward show of their belief. But the teachings of the Russian Orthodox and Moravian churches have a tight grip on local traditions and it's
